National borders have no meaning for the atmosphere. This was demonstrated to the world by the Chernobyl nuclear plant disaster and again by the eruption of Mt. Pinatubo. Whatever enters the atmosphere in one country soon travels around the world. And so, scientists are now worried about the global effects of air pollution. Research shows, in fact, that the earth's atmosphere is changing in ways that could be destructive to life. Pollution could be a major cause of this.

One of the pollutants that is causing the greatest concern is carbon dioxide. It is released into the air when coal or petroleum is burned. Carbon dioxide has always been a part of our atmosphere, the product of certain natural processes. However, in recent decades, the amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere has greatly increased. This is the result of an enormous increase in the amount of coal and petroleum burned fuel.

The result of the increase of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere is the so-called "greenhouse effect". The carbon monoxide acts like a glass screen, making the sun's heat more intense. There are already signs of global warming, say many scientists. Over the next century, average temperatures could rise by as much as four degrees centigrade.
