Do you know that ants are the most intelligent of all insects? Large groups or colonies of them are founded by the females. These colonies live in networks of passageways which are several feet below the earth's surface and often cover an area of fifty to one hundred square yards. The nests, or anthills as they are more commonly called, are the only part above ground, and are sometimes as much as six feet in diameter.

In Europe some species build mounds or homes entirely aboveground. The only species in America that builds aboveground is found in Wisconsin. These ants build a mound about twenty inches in height.

Another European species build nests of clay or mud in hollow trees, housing thousands of ants in a single nest.

Probably the most unusual of all nests is a type found only in Australia. In these nests the part aboveground is shaped like the branched of a tree.

If someone should tell you that there is a fire inside you and that this fire is keeping you warm, you might think it was meant to be a joke. But that is pretty nearly what is taking place.

Most of you know that a fire will burn only when plenty of air is supplied. The oxygen of the air combines with the carbon of the coal or wood and gives out heat. In like manner the oxygen taken into the body through the lungs unites with the carbon of the muscles and other parts of the body, producing heat which warms the body. You do not see any fire in the body because the oxygen unites with the carbon so gradually that only sufficient heat is produced to keep the temperature of the body at about 98.6 degrees.

If the temperature of a healthy body rises above 98.6 degrees—called normal—it is automatically cooled off. If you have ever dipped a thermometer in gasoline or chloroform and watched—it while the liquid was evaporating or drying off, you will understand how the body is cooled. While the liquid is evaporating the temperature falls very rapidly, very often from five to ten degrees in as many minutes. Nature has a similar method for cooling the body. When the little particles of water, called perspiration, are evaporated from the skin the body is cooled to 98.6 degrees.
